We have had a few enquiries for events this year, 1 of which we have confirmed.

6) The St. Ives Community Choir Accounts 2016 Report

- * We started 2016 with £3,478.58.
- * We had 5 donations amounting to £330.
- * We had a very generous gift of an iPad from Charles Reynolds of CJ Medical, which Alison will use instead of fighting with the paper music and clothes pegs.
- * We paid out £186.84 for Public Liability and Keyboard Insurances and our Website Domain Registration.
- * If anyone has any extra copies of music could you please let Anne have them back as we have to pay for the purchase and replacement of music?
- * Rent for the Chapel was £540.
- * £1,094.02 was paid in subscriptions.
- * The total amount we raised this year for charities, either on our own or in conjunction with others was about £3,800.
- * Income over expenditure was £323 down this year which leaves us with £3,155.57 to start 2017.

7) Musical Director's Report

William informed us that we have sung 37 different songs over 17 concerts this year. There have been 6 new ones, 3 in Cornish and Kelly's. We have also sung in 6 new venues. We have had a change in uniform, ladies in all black with their Cornish brooch and men in all black with coloured tie.

The Paignton concert was a success. He thanked Trevor and Caroline who came down.

William posed the question, "Where do we see ourselves as a choir in 12 months time?" Most people said no music. Julie asked the question "When was the first concert?" to make sure that we had time to learn the words.

Mike- More recruitment evenings

Steve- We are a community choir so there must be a fun element and not too serious.

Lynne- We need to be stretched.

Dave - We need to be careful and not stretch too far.

Don- To improve the way we are singing

Maureen- To sing in 3 parts. However we do now have more men than we did.

Joan- To be perfect.

William went on to say that we need to come to practice especially when there is a concert. **We need to be at at least 4 practises.** Our age profile is increasing. How can we encourage younger people?

William thanked Alan for the website, Bill for the photos and reports, Malcolm for the reports, Don and Maureen for the trip, Carbis Bay Methodist Chapel and Alison. Also David Tremelling and Katrina for filling in with playing the keyboard and Trish for finding the music.
